The Revista Internacional & Comparada de Derechos Humanos (ISSN: 2992-8613) is a biannual academic and scientific publication of the Inter-American Academy of Human Rights focused on disseminating analytical, critical, contextual, and theoretical human rights studies from a national, international, and comparative perspective.

Guiding theme of the issue:

Texts related to the general theme of human rights may be submitted for consideration for publication. However, the guiding theme of this issue will be "Enforced Disappearance". Some suggested topics for contributions are:

- 1.** Study of the normative and conceptual framework in local, national, international, and comparative spheres regarding enforced disappearance
- 2.** The effect of enforced disappearance of persons on the human rights of indirect victims
- 3.** The differentiated impact of enforced disappearance on groups in vulnerable situations
- 4.** Analysis of public policies and programs regarding the search for, identification, and return of disappeared persons from a human rights perspective
- 5.** Historical analysis of the phenomenon of disappearance
- 6.** The challenges of criminal investigation in cases of disappearance of persons
- 7.** The role of groups of relatives of disappeared persons and the right to truth

Types of contributions accepted:

a) Doctrinal articles. Academically sound texts on the publication's priority and specific topics, focusing on the study of human rights from a national, international, and comparative perspective. To decide on publication, the texts received are subjected to a double-blind peer review system. Approximate length 7,000 to 15,000 words.

b) Essays. Texts in which various themes within the national, international, and comparative study of human rights are analyzed, reflected on, interpreted, and evaluated through the essay genre. Approximate length 4,000 to 7,500 words.

c) Normative and jurisprudential comments. Texts in which the regulations and judicial rulings that observe relevant or novel criteria related to human rights are analyzed from a national, international, and comparative perspective. Approximate length 2,500 to 3,500 words.

d) Notes. Texts in which relevant contemporary issues related to human rights are reflected on and analyzed from a national, international, and comparative perspective. Approximate length 1,500 to 2,000 words.

e) Bibliographic reviews. Summaries that report on the content, contribution, and significance of academically relevant legal works in the field of human rights published in recent years, or edited earlier and considered essential to the topics addressed by the issue being called for. Approximate length 500 to 1,500 words.

Language of contributions:

Spanish or English.

Publication date of the call:

06 July 2026

Deadline for submission of contributions:

31 August 2026

Publication date of the issue called for:

01 December 2026

Formal instructions:

All submissions must meet the following requirements:

1. Be an unpublished text.
2. Strictly follow the editorial guidelines of the IDH Academy, available at: <https://revistas.uadec.mx/ICDH/Lineamiento>
3. Be sent in an Open Office or Microsoft Word file to the email address: revista.icdh@academiaidh.org.mx, accompanied by the signed PDF format "Declaration of originality, ethical integrity and publication license" (available at: [revistas.uadec.mx.docx](#)). At the time of submission, the email subject must state: "Contribution volume IX number II".
4. When the submission includes tables, graphs, diagrams, or images, these must be incorporated directly into the body of the text and not attached as files separately. In addition, they must be accompanied by the full reference to the source. If it is their own material, the authors must expressly state ownership of the corresponding rights and assume responsibility for its use.
5. Doctrinal articles must include the title, abstract, and keywords in English and Spanish. The submitted file must not contain information that identifies the authors; their name and ORCID will only be indicated in the format "Declaration of originality, ethical integrity and publication license".
